


VBS is for ages 3 years old to 6th grade. The youth (7th-12th grade) will be our helpers.




May 25th


Weather Policy

<u>Easter Communion</u> — On Easter Sunday, a room was dedicated for anyone to participate in *Easter Communion* in a private and reflective manner.




